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Chapter 1: Overview

The CA Process Automation UCF-USM Connector allows Unified Connector Framework (UCF) Connectors to be used in automated processes. The UCF-USM Connector provides process operators that support the UCF create, read, update, delete (CRUD), and event subscription interfaces. The operators expose Unified Service Model (USM) object types and properties.


Using the common USM Model and standard UCF interfaces allows the UCF-USM Module to be compatible with all UCF Connectors and Containers.

This document describes how the UCF Connectors can be utilized in CA Process Automation to build customer solutions.

The UCF-USM Connector consists of the following components:

- UCF-USM Module
- UCF Triggers
- UCF Connector Container

The UCF-USM Module and UCF Triggers are remote UCF Connector clients, using the Broker and Connector proxy interfaces, as illustrated:

The UCF-USM Connector Guide is intended for the following primary audiences:

- Administrators who install or maintain the UCF-USM Module or a CA Process Automation instance
- Developers and Designers of CA Process Automation processes who want their processes to interact with UCF-USM

If you are an Administrator, this guide assumes that you have read and understand the content described in the CA IT Process Automation Manager Administration Guide.

If you are a CA Process Automation Process developer or a designer, this guide assumes that you have read and understood these concepts and associated procedures:

- How to create and run CA Process Automation processes (as described in the CA Process Automation User Guide)
- How to create Process and Named Datasets (as described in the CA Process Automation User Guide)
- The basics of a UCF-USM environment

Terminology

Connector

A Connector is a module that integrates CA Process Automation (formerly CA IT Process Automation Management, also known as CA IT PAM) with an external software program.

Module

A set of functionally related Operators sharing a common configuration. All the CA Process Automation connectors are modules, but the reverse is not true. CA Process Automation contains built-in modules that provide functionality, but which do not interface with specific external applications.

Operator

A software element that implements an action and is one of the building blocks of a process in CA Process Automation.

USM

The Unified Service Model (USM) is a schema of common object types and properties to which data from all connectors is converted. The USM schema enables analysis of data from all domain managers in a common interface with identical formatting.

Prerequisites

Following are the prerequisites for installing the connector:

- For CA Process Automation version 3.1 and later, this module is automatically included in the base release, and you can proceed to configure the UCF-USM Module.
- For CA IT PAM version 3.0 SP1, apply first a patch to enhance CA IT PAM for UCF support (see Installing the Patch (see page 10)), and then install the connector (see Install the Connector (see page 11)).
- For versions of CA IT PAM before 3.0 SP1, upgrade to either CA IT PAM version 3.0 SP1, or CA Process Automation version 3.1 (or later).
- The UCF Catalyst connectors that the UCF-USM Module connector module can interface to have their own prerequisites, and can be hosted either under CA Spectrum SA or a separate UCF Connector Container.

See UCF Connector Container (see page 19) for details.

Install the Patch

This patch must be installed for version CA IT PAM 3.0 SP1. If the targeted instance of CA Process Automation is a version earlier than CA IT Process Automation Management 3.0 SP1, and you cannot or do not want to use CA Process Automation version 3.1 or later, then download CA IT PAM 3.0 SP1 from support.ca.com, and then upgrade your CA Process Automation instance following the instructions provided with the release.

To install the patch

- Install this patch against the Domain Orchestrator using the same account as was
 used to install CA Process Automation on the computer containing your Domain
 Orchestrator. If your Domain Orchestrator is clustered, install the patch against the
 primary node. The first Orchestrator installed is the Primary Orchestrator, and this
 can be confirmed by checking that oasis.server.isPrimary=true is set in the
 OasisConfig.properties file found in <itpam_root_directory>\server\c2o\.config,
 where <itpam_root_directory> is the directory where CA Process Automation was
 installed.
- 2. Shut down the Orchestrator before applying the patch. Other Orchestrator instances can remain running. We suggest that you close other applications before applying this patch.
- 3. When installing the patch on Windows, run IT_PAM_patch_installer_3_0_SP1_UCF_enablement_w32.exe for JRE (32-bit).
- 4. After you provide the inputs, the installer updates your CA Process Automation instance with the new binaries containing the fix. Restart CA Process Automation.
- After you restart Domain Orchestrator, the patch contents will be propagated to any other Orchestrator that is a part of the domain after the mirroring interval has elapsed.

Default: 15 minutes

Note: You can also install the connector (see <u>Install the Connector</u> (see page 11)) before restarting the Orchestrator.

6. Restart each Orchestrator for the patch to take effect.

Install the Connector

To install the Connector

- 1. Log on to the computer and account used to install the CA Process Automation Primary Domain Orchestrator.
- 2. Install this connector against the Domain Orchestrator using the same account as was used to install CA Process Automation on the computer containing your Domain Orchestrator. If your Domain Orchestrator is clustered, install the patch against the primary node. The first Orchestrator installed is the Primary Orchestrator, and this can be confirmed by checking that oasis.server.isPrimary=true is set in the OasisConfig.properties file found in <itpam_root_directory>\server\c2o\.config, where <itpam_root_directory> is the directory where CA Process Automation was installed.
- 3. Shut down the Orchestrator before installing the connector. Other Orchestrator instances can remain running. We suggest that you close other applications before applying this patch.
- 4. Run the appropriate version of the installer for your operating system.

Typically this will be IT_PAM_connector_installer_UCF-USM_1_X_w32.exe for Windows environments with a 32-bit JRE installed. X in this case is the installer version number.

For Linux and UNIX systems, run the installer as follows to help ensure that it is run under the Bourne shell, and to avoid the need to use chmod to set this file as an executable.

sh IT_PAM_connector_installer_UCF-USM_1_X.sh

5. When the Welcome screen displays, click Next to proceed or click Cancel to exit the installation.

The Licensing terms for this Connector display.

- 6. Select "I accept the agreement" and click Next to proceed. Click Cancel to terminate the installation.
- 7. Specify the directory where the CA Process Automation Primary Domain Orchestrator was installed (if it differs from the default value) by entering the complete path to the directory, or by clicking Browse and locating the directory.
- Click Next.

The installer verifies that the Primary Domain Orchestrator is down, and a dialog displays where you select the components to install. (You only have the choice of this Connector.)

9. Click the check box to select this Connector, and click Next to continue.

The installer deploys the components of the new module to the Primary Domain Orchestrator (This takes a few minutes).

10. Click Finish to complete the installation.

11. Restart the Primary Domain Orchestrator.

The installation.log file is located here: <itpam_root_directory>\server\c2o where <itpam root directory> is the folder specified in Step 5.

The newly installed module is not available immediately on any secondary Orchestrators. All components are mirrored within the time specified by the mirroring interval for secondary Orchestrators.

12. After all components have been mirrored, stop and restart each Orchestrator and Agent to make the new module available for use.

Configure UCF-USM Module

To configure the UCF-USM Module in CA Process Automation


 Go to Configuration Browser and click UCF Module and complete the following details:

UCF Broker URL


The default UCF Broker URL can be specified in the UCF Module configuration. Any operator that does not specify a UCF Broker URL parameter defaults to the UCF Broker URL in the UCF Module configuration.

Product property configuration file name

The Product property configuration file name is used to customize the properties shown in the generic create operator (see create operator (see page 13)).



2. Go to the UCF Trigger Properties tab and specify the subscription details.



Chapter 3: UCF-USM Components

UCF-USM Module

The UCF-USM Module includes CRUD and event subscription operators that can be invoked on any UCF Connector. All operator parameters can contain expressions for maximum flexibility in building content. CA Process Automation processes can be created using any combination of these operators to construct integrations across multiple products. In addition, the UCF-USM operators could be used as base operators to build custom operators for product-specific solutions.

Following are some of the commonly used operators that can be used to create integrated solution using UCF Connectors in CA Process Automation.

Create Operator

The Generic Create operator supports the CRUD create and update operations on any USM type.

This Operator takes the following input parameters:

UCFBrokerURL

Defines the UCF Broker URL. Defaults to the UCF Broker URL in the UCF Module configuration.

MdrProduct

Unique identifier of the connecting product.

MdrProdInstance

Unique identifier of the instance of the connecting product as registered in the UCF Broker.

Create

Indicates whether the operator creates an object or updates an existing object.

Itemtype

Specifies the USM type of the object that is created or updated.

Values:

Alert, ComputerSystem, Router, Service, and so on.

Properties

In addition to the generic CRUD operators, there are specific Create/Update operators for each USM type. The operator parameters contain the properties of the USM type.

Customizing the Properties

The Properties form can be customized using the "Product property configuration file name". If the MdrProduct and itemtype values match an entry in the "Product property configuration file", then the form displays according to the following rules:

- If the property is not defined in the USM type, then it is a custom property and is added to the form.
- If the property is defined in the USM type, then it is added to the form.
- If the property is defined in the USM type and has an alias name, then it is added to the form using the alias name.

For example, this entry displays the Alert form as shown.

The tooltip of properties with alias names indicates the USM property name.

Create/Update Operators

In addition to the generic CRUD operators, there are specific Create/Update operators for each USM type. The operator parameters are created from the properties of the USM types. These operators are dynamically constructed from the USM schema during UCF Module initialization. Future changes to the USM model will not require any CA Process Automation patches.

Delete Operator

The Delete operator supports the CRUD delete operation on any USM type. The parameters identify the MDR and the object to be deleted.

This Operator takes the following input parameters:

UCFBrokerURL

Defines the UCF Broker URL. Defaults to the UCF Broker URL in the UCF Module configuration

MdrProduct

Unique identifier of the connecting product.

MdrProdInstance

Unique identifier of the instance of the connecting product as registered in the UCF Broker.

MdrElementID

Unique identifier of the object in the connecting product.

ClassName

Class name of the object (Alert, ComputerSystem, and so on.)

Get Operator

The Get operator supports the CRUD read operation on any USM type. The parameters identify the MDR and the UCF get filter values (entitytype, itemtype, recursive, id, and updatedAfter). In addition, the MaxNumberOfObjects parameter restricts the number of objects returned by the operator.

This Operator takes the following input parameters:

UCFBrokerURL

Defines the UCF Broker URL. Defaults to the UCF Broker URL in the UCF Module configuration

MdrProduct

Unique identifier of the connecting product.

MdrProdInstance

Unique identifier of the instance of the connecting product as registered in the UCF Broker.

entitytype

Specifies the type of the entity. Values can be "Alert", "Item" or "Relationship".

itemtype

Specifies the type of item. If not specified, then all types are retrieved.

recursive

Specifies if the connector should recursively include the item and its constituent children and relationships.

id

Specifies a specific object identifier (same as the MdrElementID)

updatedAfter

Specifies only objects updated after a specific time.

MaxNumberOfObjects

Specifies the maximum number of objects to retrieve.

SubscribeToChanges Operator

The SubscribeToChanges operator supports event subscriptions on any USM type using UCF filters. The parameters identify the MDR and the UCF filter values (entitytype, itemtype, recursive, id, and updatedAfter). In addition, the MaxNumberOfObjects parameter restricts the number of objects returned by the operator. The TimeOut parameter specifies the number of seconds after which the subscription expires. The operator completes when either the number of objects are returned or the timeout expires.

This Operator takes the following input parameters:

UCFBrokerURL

Defines the UCF Broker URL. Defaults to the UCF Broker URL in the UCF Module configuration

MdrProduct

Unique identifier of the connecting product.

MdrProdInstance

Unique identifier of the instance of the connecting product as registered in the UCF Broker.

entitytype

Specifies the type of the entity. Values can be "Alert", "Item" or "Relationship".

itemtype

Specifies the type of item. If not specified, then all types are retrieved.

recursive

Specifies if the connector should recursively include the item and its constituent children and relationships.

id

Specifies a specific object identifier (same as the MdrElementID).

updatedAfter

Specifies only objects updated after a specific time.

timeOut

Specifies the number of seconds after which the subscription expires.

MaxNumberOfObjects

Specifies the maximum number of objects to retrieve.

UCF Trigger


UCF Trigger subscriptions are specified in the CA Process Automation Configuration browser. The UCF Trigger supports a list of subscriptions, each referencing a UCF Connector with a filter. When a matching event is received from the UCF Connector, the specified CA Process Automation process is started.

The following sample shows how to set a UCF trigger that starts a process whenever an Alert object is created or updated in SCOM. The properties of the Alert object are available as process variables.


To set the UCF Trigger


1. Go to UCF Subscription, give the subscription details as shown, and submit the changes.

UCF Connector Container

The UCF Connector Container is a lightweight Container for UCF Connectors. The container runs as a separate process. UCF Connectors can be installed into the Container.

To install the UCF-USM Connector Container, first run CA_UCF_Connector_Container_Installer_1.0-w32.exe on the Windows machine where you want to host your UCF connectors.

You may have multiple containers within your network, but not more than one per server.

Add a Connector to the Container

To add a new Connector to the Container, execute the connector installer and specify the container install directory.

Modify Connector Configurations

To modify the connector configuration, manually edit the configuration file which is located in <container>\ conf\container config.xml.

The configuration file contains the Connector class name, the Connector inbound and outbound policy filenames, and Connector initialization parameters. The file also contains UCF context parameters that allow multiple peer brokers.

Connector initialization parameters whose names contain "password" must be encrypted. To generate an encrypted value, use the <container>\bin\container_encrypt.bat script.

To change the Container logging level, edit the <Container>\bin\container.conf file.

The scripts in the <Container>\bin\wrapper_32 directory manage the UCF Connector as shown in the table:

Script	Description	
containersvcinst.bat	Install the Container as a Windows service	
containersvcuninst.bat	Uninstall the Container as a Windows service	
startcontainer.bat	Start the Container service	
stopcontainer.bat	Stop the Container service	
containersvc.bat	Start the Container on console	


Chapter 4: CA Process Automation Content: Example


The UCF-USM Module operators can be used directly in processes to build generic content. You can also use the operators as base operators of custom operators for product-specific content.

Consider the example of creating Service Desk Incidents from SCOM Alerts.

To build a simple solution

- 1. Add the SubscribeToChanges operator to a process.
- 2. Select the SCOM Connector from the MdrProduct/MdrProdInstance lists and Alert from the entitytype list.
- 3. Add the IncidentUpdate operator to the process. Select the Create check box and the Service Desk Connector from the list.





Apply Severt

4. Set the values of the Incident properties using the properties of the SCOM Alert object as variable expressions.

The content is now available for use.

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

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
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
